ENF Dinner

Please mark your calendar for this year's ENF Dinner. The dinner will be held on Saturday, September 17, 2016. Last year we held a casino night and everyone seemed to enjoy the evening. This year, we are considering several possibilities and have yet to narrow it down. So look for the particulars in the September issue of the Call.

The ENF was founded by the Grand Lodge in 1928 with an initial endowment of \$100,000. Since inception, the ENF has contributed more than \$429.6 million toward Elks charitable projects nationwide. These funds enable programs that support youth, honor veterans, and meet needs in areas where Elks live and work.

This year, the ENF allocated \$9.77 million to fund the Community Investments Program, investing in Elks communities through grants for Elks Lodges. Community Investments Program grants—which include Beacon, Gratitude, Promise and Impact grants—offer your Lodge an opportunity to serve your community in ways that will raise the Lodge's profile, energize the membership, encourage former members to return to the fold, and gain the notice of people who want to be part of an organization that's doing great things.

The ENF is able to help Elks build stronger communities thanks to contributions from our generous donors. Since inception, we have received more than \$243.3 million in contributions and bequests. Today we boast more than 100,000 active donors and an endowment fund valued at \$597.3 million.

Recipe of the Month

BREAD PUDDING w/whiskey sauce

6 cups dry bread
4 cups Milk
4 Eggs
1 ½ cups sugar
3 Tbsp. Vanilla
1 cup Raisins

SAUCE:
8 Tbsp. Butter
1 cup Sugar
6 Tbsp. Whiskey
1 egg

Break bread into large bowl, pour milk over bread and let stand at least 1 hour. In another bowl beat eggs: add sugar and vanilla pour over bread. Stir in raisins. Pour into a greased baking dish.

Bake 45-50 minutes @ 350 degrees until puffy and golden brown.

SAUCE: Melt butter in small sauce pan and stir in sugar until dissolved, cook on medium heat until mixture bubbles and becomes clear. Remove from heat. Whisk in egg and beat until cool. Add whiskey. Pour sauce over hot pudding and place on lowest rack of broiler. Broil until sauce bubbles and becomes thick. Serve warm with whipped cream.

Americanism Message

As some of you are aware, Tom Tuttle was the Idaho State Elks Americanism Chairman for years. Tom has since passed, but his message lives on. Below is the wonderful reminder that Tom shared with us each year:

What does it all mean? Why must we continue our patriotism? On June 14, 2016, a Flag Day ceremony was performed at the Veterans Home in Boise. This ceremony showed the many flags throughout our history as a nation, displaying them and unfolding the history behind each flag.

In the beginning our nation was a colony under the rule of England. It was felt by our fore fathers that we were not being dealt with fairly by our ruler and a change was needed, even at the cost of lives. These brave colonists undertook their goal of being their own nation with a government of the people, by the people and for the people. We had many battles along the way that challenged our right to be a free, self-governed nation.

The first of course was the Revolutionary War; the second, the War of 1812 in which Francis Scott Key wrote the idea for the national anthem during the great battle of fleets which could have lost us our freedom to govern ourselves. It was all lost until the next morning when Key and a Dr. Beame caught sight of the flag still waiving. To quote Key "O Say, does that Star-Spangled Banner yet wave, o'er the land of the free and the home of the brave". The fort held by 1,000 brave men had held and turned the tide in the war.

Later the Civil War was waged in order to bring back a united nation rather than a divided nation. Each war created a different threat to our sovereignty. In each war, men and women gave their lives in order to ensure that sovereignty. What it all means, is that our values must continue to grow in the desire to preserve a nation in which people are free to govern themselves, defend themselves and enjoy rights that so many nations would love to have, but that are unavailable to them.

A Democratic government is a great form of government, but it takes people with a strong will to survive. We look at our flag as a symbol of that freedom! We look at our veterans as the defense of that Freedom! We look at our God as the Devine leader! As we observe our Independence Day, give some thought to why this celebration exists and how lucky we are to have had those brave men and women who stood up for its existence.
