Please mark your calendar for this year's ENF Dinner. The dinner will be held on Saturday, September 23, 2017. This year the menu will consist of ribeye steak, baked potatoes, tossed salad, dinner rolls and dessert.

Dinner will be served from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., and the band Free-Style will play after dinner so we can dance the night away. The cost for the evening is \$25.00 per person. As usual, tickets are available at the bar, from any officers, or from the many wonderful members who take their time and efforts to sale tickets for our events.

As you know, we do take reservations over the phone via Will-Call, however, if you reserve tickets, please make sure you show up and pay for them. We buy food in accordance to ticket sales and if will call tickets are not picked up, we've just wasted a lot of money on too much food.

As the cooler weather starts in a nice juicy steak really hits the spot so come down and enjoy good food, good company, good music and allow us to do some good for our community.

The ENF was founded by the Grand Lodge in 1928 with an initial endowment of \$100,000. Since inception, the ENF has contributed more than \$453.9 million toward Elks charitable projects nationwide.

These funds enable programs that support youth, honor veterans, and meet needs in areas where Elks live and work. This year, the ENF allocated \$12.5 million to fund the Community Investments Program, investing in Elks communities through grants for Elks Lodges. Community Investments Program grants—which include Beacon, Gratitude, Promise and Impact grants—offer your Lodge an opportunity to serve your community in ways that will raise the Lodge's profile, energize the membership, encourage former members to return to the fold, and gain the notice of people who want to be part of an organization that's doing great things.

The ENF is able to help Elks build stronger communities thanks to contributions from our generous donors. Since inception, we have received more than \$251.6 million in contributions and bequests. Today we boast more than 100,000 active donors and an endowment fund valued at \$641.9 million.

Recipe of the Month

COUNTRY FRIED STEAK or CHICKEN

½ cup flour
½ tsp. Salt
½ tsp. Pepper
¾ cup buttermilk
1 cup crushed Saltines
4 Cube steaks (1 lb.)
3 Tbsp. cooking oil
1 can cream of mushroom soup
1 cup Milk

Combine flour, salt, & pepper in a shallow bowl. Place buttermilk in a shallow bowl. Place saltine crumbs in a shallow bowl. Coat steaks with flour mixture, then dip into buttermilk and coat with crumbs.

In a large skillet over medium-high heat, cook steaks in hot oil for 2-3 minutes per side or until golden and cooked to desired doneness. Remove and keep warm.

To make gravy; Add undiluted soup and milk in skillet; bring to a boil, stirring to loosen browned bits from pan.

Option: Chicken can be used in place of cube steaks.

Option: Crushed corn flakes can be used in place of crackers.

Option: 1 cup of milk & 2 Tbsp. vinegar stirred together and left for a few minutes until thick can replace buttermilk.


